## Hope Thrives At 2008 Peace Camps

The Creativity for Peace family of campers grew to 126 this year, as 28 young women arrived in New Mexico for our ninth and tenth summer peace camps.

For the first time Israeli girls came from Sderot, Nazareth, Shefaram Kibbutz Nan, and Neve Shalom/Wahat Al-Salam, an intentional community of Jews and Palestinians. Our Palestinian girls came from the West Bank cities of Jenin, Nablus, Ramallah, and Tulkarem. Ten young leaders supported the campers while enhancing their own leadership skills.

As our family expands, so does our need for trained dialogue facilitators. Aura Hammer, a Jewish Israeli, and Brigitte Sarji, a Palestinian living in Israel, accompanied us from the Middle East to learn to use our successful reconciliation methods. As always, remarkable transformations took place as the girls shared their deep pain and listened to others with an open heart.

Noa, a Jewish camper from the Northern Galilee, summarized her experience this way: "I hated. I listened. I understood. I loved."

Khaloud, a Palestinian from Tulkarem, said, "What I experienced here gave me hope. I believe this hope will grow. I hope that the next generation will talk to each other so that we can love and forgive one another. May we young people bring that love to the whole world."

In our art program, campers created a powerful labyrinth with hand-painted doorways, which remains a gift to the land and to those who visit. Our field trips gave the girls an opportunity to experience what life would be like if there was peace at home. Working in pairs on the high wire at the Santa Fe Mountain Center, they learned to rely on each other. They expressed their feelings through movement under the guidance of the talented women of Wise Fool and National Dance Institute. In Chef Johnny Vee's cooking class, the girls bonded over enchiladas, guacamole, and sopapillas. In between there was shopping, singing, and a lot of dancing.

Our young leaders practiced the leadership and communication skills they have been learning in the Middle East. They spoke at private fundraisers and in radio and newspaper interviews. In partnership with Santa Fe Rotary, they spread the words of peace and coexistence to groups in Albuquerque, Española, Farmington, and El Paso.

Three hundred people from the community joined us for a screening of *Encounter Point*, a documentary about families from both sides who have lost their loved ones to the conflict and have chosen peace over revenge. The movie was

inspiring and so were the girls, who afterwards answered questions from the audience. Volunteers joined us for a picnic on our camp land and 100 guests came to our traditional open house, braving a sudden, dramatic hail storm that had the girls shouting with terror and delight.

On the final evening of the summer, campers and staff joined hands around the perimeter of the labyrinth. Candles flickered in the darkened night as the girls called out messages of love and peace to one another.

For Fairuz, a Palestinian young leader, candles are a powerful symbol of hope. "If you choose to be a peacemaker you have to be a mountain. Remember that mountain is very strong and can't be moved. Creativity for Peace gives us that power. The girls are like candles that light me up whenever I feel helpless." ☐

## Report From The Middle East

In April, young leaders met in Nazareth for two days of training and an exploration of the courage it takes to work against the mainstream. With a drama therapist, they tapped their inner strength and shared their belief that our meetings are crucial to their ability to advocate for peace.

Before leaving for New Mexico, new participants and their parents met in Jerusalem for a camp orientation. Young leaders spoke about the camp experience, led peace games, and inspired all with stories of their personal transformations.

In August, former campers gathered at Kfar Giladi. The girls went kayaking, shared meals, and participated in dialogues about how the conflict between Israel and Palestine affects their lives. A month later, young leaders worked with Ann Bradney of Core Energetics. The aim of this workshop was to help these courageous girls experience and embrace their power and emotions so that they can deal with the difficulties that exist in their world.

Even with their rage and pain, the young leaders demonstrated a strong commitment to creating a different world than the one they inherited. Ann wrote in her report, "If you long for peace in the Mideast and feel lacking in hope, spend some time with the girls of Creativity for Peace."

In October, 2008 campers gathered in Tiberius, overlooking the Sea of Galilee, for a weekend of dialogue, soaking in the hot springs, and a talent show. The purpose of the meeting was to give the girls the support they need to maintain and develop the many deep changes they made at camp. Our traditional holiday meeting takes place in December in Nazareth.

Although the economic situation is difficult, I ask you from the deepest place in my heart to continue supporting these courageous young women, who will bring more peace to our world. □

## We Will Never Give Up

Creativity for Peace has become a family and a path of life for me. Many things have changed inside me since getting to know the other side and having them as my friends and not as enemies anymore. I have learned to be open-minded, open-hearted, to listen and speak authentically, and to be a good leader with all the necessary skills.

Thanks to Creativity for Peace, I have stopped judging people because of what I've been told about them by relatives or by history. After all, we are all human beings regardless of where we come from, what religion we believe in, or what groups we belong to.

Life is too short, so why we should be afraid to live this day? What act did I commit to have this kind of life? It's time to say "stop!" We don't want to continue the cycle of blood. We just lose the people we love. To hate is much harder than to love. This is what I found out from Creativity

The first step is the most difficult but it's worth it when we work together, hand-in-hand. This is what Creativity for Peace does when it organizes meetings between Muslims, Christians, and Jews, between three nations with different points of view, different stories, and beliefs, but the same hope for peace. I am very grateful and proud to be part of such an honorable organization.

The girls of Creativity for Peace support one another. Hopelessness is not an option. We will never give up. □

Recent scholarship recipient Khadrah Jean (K.J.) AbuZant, a Palestinian from the West Bank, is studying psychology at An-Najah University in Nablus. A 2006 camper and 2008 young leader, she has worked with Seeds of Peace and Windows for Peace. "I want to help heal people, especially children, from the effects of the conflict on their minds, hearts, and souls," she says.

Diana Fraije, a Palestinian from the West Bank, is a communications student at Bir Zeit University in Ramallah. Diana was a camper in 2006 and a young leader in 2007 and 2008. "I got tired of seeing my people in the darkness of anger and hate," she says. "After camp I learned that everyone can have a great voice which can change others, so I took that as my mission. I want to become a journalist with a message of peace and forgiveness."
